



## **MEMBERSHIP RULES, REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES**





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## **INTRODUCTION**

The rules and regulations described herein shall serve to define the conduct of all Roxboro Valley Association, Inc. (RVA) members and guests while on RVA premises. The “premises” of Roxboro Valley Swim and Tennis Club is defined as all grounds, buildings structures and facilities contained within the approximate five acres of property owned by the Roxboro Valley Association, Inc., in the land lot 8-17 TH. Dist., Fulton County, Georgia.

RVA members and guests are expected to conduct themselves in a responsible, courteous, safe and hygienic manner at all times and in accordance with the guidelines set forth. The rules and regulations are illustrative only and are not designed to cover every conceivable incident and as such they may be amended from time to time at the discretion of the Board of Directors (Board) to reflect new circumstances. Specific incidents not covered in the rules and regulations will be reviewed by the Board of Directors and appropriately addressed.

RVA reserves the right to fine, suspend or terminate the membership of any member whose behavior (or whose guest’s behavior) is not in keeping with the spirit and intent of RVA as a private family recreational facility.

Amendments to the rules and regulations made after the publication of the current year’s membership directory will be posted on the RVA website. No other such notice will be provided and members are expected to abide by such amendments.



## MEMBERSHIP

### Membership Categories:

- **Full Membership:**
  - (i) a married couple, [with or without children]
  - (ii) two domestic partners, [with or without children] or
  - (iii) a single parent and their dependent children and/or step-children, who are under the age of 23 and living at home or attending school on a fulltime basis or in the military.
- **Associate Membership:**
  - “A” - Individual membership for one adult who is over sixty-five years of age.
  - “B” - Individual membership for one unmarried adult who has no minor dependents.
  - “C” - Junior membership for an adult child of a current member who has not reached the age 30.
- **Lifetime Membership:** a member whose membership has remained in good standing for 20 consecutive years will not be required to pay any dues.

### Membership Fees and Dues

The Board of Directors of RVA shall determine the amount and terms of payment of Membership Fees and Dues payable by the members. The obligation to pay dues is not dependent on the availability of the facilities. There may be times when facilities are closed or restricted due to maintenance, health authority requirements or for RVA sponsored activities such as Swim or Tennis Lessons or team events.

The amount of Membership Fees and Dues may be changed from time to time. The amount of Membership Fees and Dues owed for a new membership is determined on the date admitted to membership. Subsequent dues are determined annually by the Board of Directors for the entire membership.

- **Membership Fee** - All members shall pay a membership fee of \$1,600 upon Board approval of membership. The Membership Fee is waived for Associate Membership Class “C”.
- **Dues** - The obligation for annual dues is to continue each year unless written notice of cancellation is received by the Board prior to April 1st of each year. Nonpayment of dues by April 1st of each year can be grounds for automatic membership termination. Invoices will be emailed in the beginning of the year and it is up to the member to make sure that the email address on file is current; Dues for each class of membership are as follows:
  - Full Membership:                 \$775.00 per year**
  - Associate Membership:       \$400.00 per year**
- **Application Deposit** - A non-refundable deposit of \$50 must accompany any application for membership. This amount will be credited toward the Membership Fee when due, if the applicant is admitted.



No dues or part thereof shall be refunded in the event that pool or tennis facilities are under repair, rendered unusable, or required to be closed for any purpose.

### **Guests**

Members in good standing are eligible to bring guests to swim, play tennis or participate in RVA sponsored activities (whenever permitted). The host member must accompany his/her guest on the premises at all times and is responsible for the conduct and safety of said guest. All guests must register prior to utilizing the facilities by signing in and paying the appropriate guest fee.

Each guest is limited to two visits per month. Babysitters may be exempt from this restriction provided that prior arrangements have been made with the Membership Director. The member is responsible for the actions of all guests including babysitters and nannies. Members wishing to bring more than 6 guests on a single visit must obtain prior permission from the Membership Director. Parties, leagues, meetings and other functions with large groups must be scheduled on a first come, first serve basis in advance with the Pool Administrator.

Members failing to properly register guests may be subject to a \$50.00 per guest fine and suspension of guest privileges or membership.

### **Guest Fees**

Guest fees are the same for swimming and tennis. Payment for guests is due at the gate or in the concession stand upon arrival to the pool. A House Guest card can be purchased for out-of-town guests staying in a member's house for at least a week.

- **Guest Fees:** \$5.00 per person per day (cash or on concession account) during regular season. Five passes for \$20 if purchased prior to the guest visit.
- **House Guest Fees:** \$20.00 per week or \$100.00 per season.



## GENERAL CONDUCT

Members and their invited guests are expected to demonstrate exemplary conduct while on the premises. Behavior which is unsafe or makes others feel uncomfortable or threatened will not be tolerated.

Examples may include (but are not limited to):

- Loud, abusive, profane or threatening language or conduct
- Rough housing, pushing, wrestling, running, and/or climbing. Squirting toys or throwing objects in a manner that intrudes on the safety or courtesy owed to other members.
- Sexually Inappropriate activities, which by example may include: patting, pinching or other inappropriate touching; overly revealing or inappropriate attire; inappropriate jokes or comments that include material unbecoming of a family environment, unwelcome flirtations, advances or propositions. The Board reserves the right to determine when inappropriate behavior warrants investigation and responsive action.

The Board takes these rules very seriously and will demand that such rules be followed. Any complaints regarding inappropriate conduct should be addressed to the Membership Committee. Depending on the circumstances, the complaining party may be asked to explain the nature of his or her complaint in writing.

Upon receiving any such complaint of misconduct, the pool Membership Committee will embark on an appropriate investigation. Once the investigation is completed, Membership Committee is committed to taking prompt and effective remedial action, which may include a verbal warning, written warning, or more severe action, up to and including suspension or termination of membership or visitation rights, as appropriate based on the aggregate circumstances.

All members are expected to properly dispose of trash and debris in the receptacles provided while taking special care to leave the facilities in a clean, tidy manner after use.

### **Parking Areas**

Limited parking is available for members and their invited guests while utilizing the pool or tennis facilities. Whenever possible, families should utilize a single vehicle in order to maximize parking availability for all families. Members and guests shall drive slowly and carefully on driveway and parking areas. Please observe special parking restrictions when in effect and be aware that the upper parking area may be reserved for recreational activities or parties, at the discretion of the Pool Manager. Motorbikes, mini bikes, golf carts, etc. are allowed to enter the parking area **ONLY** if operated by a licensed driver and only if being used as primary transportation to and from RVA. Recreational riding of such vehicles in the parking area, tennis courts or on RVA grounds is strictly prohibited.

Overflow street parking extending beyond the property should be limited to the right side of the street approaching the pool to allow adequate traffic flow and access for emergency vehicles as necessary. For overflow traffic please see the traffic flow map on the RVA website.



## **Glass**

All glass is strictly prohibited from being inside the fenced-in pool area, per local city and county ordinances. This includes bottles, glasses, condiment containers, serving dishes, Pyrex, ceramic, and any other material that can shatter and cause injury.

## **Alcohol Consumption**

The Swim Club has adopted a bring-your-own alcohol policy for adult members and their guests (ages 21 and over). This is intended to allow adults to drink moderately and responsibly during regular pool hours and special events, while being sensitive to the fact that this is a family club. Please keep in mind that this bring-your-own policy is a privilege and not a right; abuse of the policy may result in the banning of all alcohol from the Swim Club facilities. Alcohol consumption in the pool area during a Home Swim Meet is prohibited.

## **Tobacco Products**

Smoking or chewing of tobacco products or e-cigarettes is not permitted on the premises under any circumstances.

## **Illegal Drugs**

The use of illegal drugs or other illegal substances on the premises is strictly prohibited and will be reported to the appropriate law enforcement authorities.

## **Pets**

All pets must be leashed or otherwise restrained and are permitted only within member vehicles or outside the pool, sports court, playground and tennis court fences. Members shall comply with any request from other members, invited guests or RVA staff members to remove the pet. Damages or injuries caused by pets are the sole responsibility of the member. In the event RVA incurs any liability as a result of conduct by a members' pet, the member hereby expressly agrees to indemnify RVA for the amount of any loss/liability, including but not limited to damages and legal costs/attorneys' fees.

## **Lost and Found**

RVA cannot be responsible for items left on the premises, however, any found items will be placed in the lost and found on RVA premises. Check with the lifeguard for the location of the lost and found. Items not claimed within a reasonable amount of time will be donated to a local charity.

## **Shark Bites Concession Stand:**

Specific hours of Operation of RVA's Concession Stand Shark Bites will be posted on the website, but generally speaking, concessions are available for purchase during peek period of swim season. All concessions must be paid for in advance by cash, credit card, or check. No account will be allowed to maintain a negative balance. You may create a family account and pay to have an account to withdraw or children may have a separate account if parents approve. You may also pay guest fees on your account at the Shark Bites stand.





### **Damages to the Premises**

Malicious damages or intent to damage RVA property will be taken seriously. All acts of vandalism, theft or trespassing shall be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agencies (by members or non-members, adults or minors) for investigation and prosecution. Membership suspension, termination or fines may also apply.

Each member shall be liable for all breakage or damage to any property or persons as a result of the negligence or misconduct of the member, his/her family or guests. The member hereby expressly agrees to indemnify RVA for the amount of any loss/liability, including but not limited to damages and legal costs/attorneys' fees.

The construction of huts, tree houses and other structures is not permitted on the premises.

### **Solicitation, Signs, Posters, Handouts**

All materials posted or distributed on RVA property must be approved by the Pool Administrator prior to being displayed.

No person may solicit RVA members on the RVA premises, nor use the RVA membership list to solicit RVA members (whether in person, via mail or electronically) for any purpose, without the express written permission of the Board. The only permissible solicitations are those charitable/beneficent activities expressly approved in writing by the Board.

### **Grounds for Suspension and Termination**

A membership may be automatically terminated for the nonpayment of dues.

A member may be fined, reprimanded, suspended or expelled for cause by a quorum of the Board of Directors at a special meeting, but only after the member has been given reasonable time and opportunity to present his/her position. Cause for such discipline shall include the violation of any By-law, or Rule, or conduct which in the opinion of the Board of Directors is prejudicial to the welfare of the Club and its members, or any improper use of RVA property.

As stated previously, a member shall be held responsible for the conduct of his/her guests and family members. Upon the misconduct by any such guest or other person, the foregoing sanctions may be imposed against the member as set forth above.

### **Waiver of Liability**

All use of RVA property shall be undertaken by a member or guest at his/her sole risk. RVA shall not be liable for any injuries or any damage to any member or guest, or the property of any member or guest, or be subject to any claim, demand, injury or damages whatsoever, including, without limitation, those damages resulting from acts of active or passive negligence on the part of RVA, its officers or agents. The member host is responsible for the conduct of his/her guest. Each member shall be liable for all breakage or damage to any property or persons as a result of the negligence or misconduct of the member, his/her family members or guests.



## **POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS**

### **Pool Hours and Season Open**

Generally speaking, the summer season commences Memorial Day until mid-August, however, the Board of Directors will determine annually the dates and hours for “early” and “late” season openings. The pool may be closed from time to time for special RVA sponsored events, for required maintenance, and for swim team or dive team practice or meets. Other adverse weather or health indications may require that the pool be closed for a period of time to be determined by the Board of Directors or the lifeguards on duty.

In order to provide a safe and orderly swim environment, members and their invited guests or approved Child Care Providers must comply with the following list of rules while applying principles of common sense to address other unforeseen circumstances not specifically listed below. Close supervision, courteous and respectful behavior should govern all actions.

Please visit the RVA website for details season opening and pool hours.

### **Safety**

Lifeguards are on duty for the purpose of maintaining general safety conditions in and around the pool. Members are responsible for following all pool regulations, those included on the website and all directives provided by the on duty Lifeguards. Failure to follow Lifeguard directives may result in membership suspension, termination or fine. Please use good judgment and avoid distracting on duty Lifeguards from their responsibilities.

Solo bathing for anyone over 18 is permitted. Please note that there is no lifeguard present during off-hours swimming, and as a result solo bathers should use extra caution and be aware that solo swimming is at your own risk.

The period of ‘Adult Swim’ occurs at ten minutes to the hour for ten minutes to allow the lifeguards a short break and during which no children will be allowed in the pool. An exception to this rule is if an adult is swimming with a child under the age of 3.



**The following is not permitted in and around the pool area:**

1. Unruly behavior including pushing, running, dunking, wrestling or other acts that could annoy or endanger others.
2. Children 18 and under in the pool during adult swim (see above regarding Safety)
3. No food or drink within 5 feet of the pool
4. Glass (see paragraph above regarding prohibition of all glass)
5. Sharp or breakable toys
6. Audible radios or televisions (except as provided by RVA for approved special events)
7. Hanging or playing on lane lines
8. Persons with an open wound or communicable skin or medical condition may not use the pool
9. Diaper changing or portable toilets (permitted in restroom areas only)
10. Sitting on the ledge of the pavilion or climbing on the concession roof
11. Unauthorized entry to the storage or guard supply areas
12. Utilization of the pool phone for longer than 5 minutes
13. Children age three and younger or children with unreliable toilet habits using either pool without approved swim diapers (see section below)
14. Unsupervised children or children over age 5 in the Kiddie Pool. An exception may be made for children that are older and unable to swim.
15. More than 10 children in the Kiddie Pool
16. Large floats, beach balls, kayaks or scuba equipment except at the discretion of the lifeguards or during an approved RVA event.
17. Children using flotation devices are not allowed to swim beyond the lifeguard stand
18. Throwing of hard balls/objects such as tennis balls, footballs, baseballs, Frisbees, etc. within the pool fence
19. Use of motorized toys – boats, subs, etc. except during slow periods and at the discretion of the lifeguards.
20. Members must be on premises to reserve tables.

**Diving**

Any person using the diving boards does so at his/her own risk and must follow the diving regulations posted by the diving boards.

1. There is no diving except from the diving boards (swim blocks are reserved solely for swim team purposes).
2. Only one person at a time is permitted on each diving board, including the steps.
3. No excessive bouncing.
4. There is no swimming under the diving boards when the boards are in use.
5. There is no diving with floats, goggles or masks.
6. Any person using the diving boards must be able to swim unassisted. Only very young children may jump/dive to their parents if they are wearing an approved personal flotation device.



### **Children's Use**

Generally speaking, children under the age of 12 (Underage Children) must be accompanied and supervised by an approved Child Care Provider, defined as a parent, family member, designated care giver or babysitter, age 15 or over. (Subject to the caveat in the following section regarding children age 9-11 who have passed the swim test). The supervising Child Care Provider must be able to clearly see and actively supervise the child at all times (e.g., the Child Care Provider may not play tennis while the Underage Child is swimming).

An approved Child Care Provider may be responsible for no more than four children under age 8 at any given time.

The pool staff is not a babysitting service. Underage Children may not be "dropped off" at the pool and left unsupervised. Neither a lifeguard nor a swim team coach is an acceptable approved Child Care Provider.

Children unable to swim on their own are not allowed beyond a depth of where they can stand, without an approved Child Care Provider in the water within arms' reach to them.

### **Swim Competency Test**

Children aged 9-11 who pass the RVA Swim Competency Test shall not be considered Underaged Children, and shall be freely allowed to use all RVA facilities without supervision.

Swim tests are administered by lifeguards upon request. A child aged 9-11 who is afforded the privilege of using the facilities without an approved Child Care Provider will be expected to follow all of the rules set forth in these regulations; if such child engages in inappropriate conduct, the pool management team will advise the child's parents; at all times the pool management team reserves the right to suspend or revoke the child's privilege of attending the pool without an approved Child Care Provider.

The test and drop off privilege is not available to guests.

Upon completion of the swim test, parents will be required to fill out an Emergency Contact and Permission to Treat form. It is recommended that children between ages 11 and 18 also have this form on file in case of emergency.

### **Approved Swim Diapers**

Children age three and under as well as children with unreliable toilet habits are required to wear approved swim diapers. The approved diaper must be made of impermeable fabric designed specifically for use as a swim diaper. These swim diapers must have tight elastic at the waist and legs to prevent leakage. Disposable swim diapers **ARE NOT APPROVED** for use at RVA unless they are worn beneath the impermeable swim diaper as is recommended for untrained children.

### **Pool Closing due to Fecal Contamination**

If fecal contamination occurs, the pool will be closed for a minimum of 24 hours. The Board may impose a fine of \$250 for first instance and \$500 for a second instance of fecal contamination.



### **Weather**

Weather conditions deemed dangerous for swimming will be determined at the discretion of the lifeguard(s), however, the pool will always be cleared in the event of thunder or lightning, and will remain closed for 30 minutes until thunder or lightning has cleared.

Off-hours swimmers are responsible for monitoring weather conditions during these times.

### **Swim Team/Swim Lessons**

During the summer season, RVA maintains a member children swim team and offers occasional swim/stroke lessons for members only. For information about the swim team or stroke lessons given by swim team coaches, contact the Swim Team Chairpersons. For non-swim team members, the lifeguards may be available for swim lessons. Contact the Pool Manager for details.

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## PAVILION RENTAL AND PARTY RULES

The RVA pavilion is available for party rental during regular pool hours but subject to excluded days and times in order to ensure that other members have use of the pool at all times.

Parties are allowed on first-come, first-served availability and must be registered and reserved with the RVA Administrator.

Parties are allowed during open hours but prohibited during these times to prevent overcrowding:

- Fridays after 4 pm
- Saturdays after 12 pm
- Sundays between 12-5 pm
- Holiday Weekends
- RVA Special Event Days and Times (such as Opening Day, Swim and Dive Meets and all Swim and Dive Team practices)

Parties may be requested “After Hours” such as on a weeknight in April or May after Swim Team Practice has ended. Email the RVA Administrator with your requested date and time. Approval will be subject to Lifeguard availability.

To reserve a party, please review the Party Policy listed below and check availability of the Pavilion on the online calendar. If the Pavilion is available at your desired time, you may submit an online request or email the RVA Administrator. Approval will be subject to Lifeguard availability. If approved, the Party Fee and Deposit must be paid in order to hold the date. Once payment has been made, you will receive a confirmation email.

There may not be more than 1 party at a time and Pool Management requires 1 hour between parties. A party is defined as a gathering of 10 or more Members or Non-Members swimming or not swimming. Party size is limited to 20 attendees including Swimmers, Non-Swimmers, and Chaperones or Parents. Parties larger than 20 may be requested but will only be allowed on days and times when the pool is not officially open. The fee for this type of party will be higher than the regular party fee and dependent on the number of party guests.

Party duration is 2 hours.

A two week notice is required for all parties in order to establish adequate Lifeguard staffing. Last minute gatherings may be accommodated assuming that a party is not already scheduled and the Pool Manager can staff a Lifeguard and Gate Attendant.



### **Party Fee:**

A party fee of \$150 is required to reserve the date, which covers the Pavilion rental, an additional Lifeguard and a Gate Attendant who will oversee checking in guests, help ensure all pool rules are followed, determine if proper clean up has occurred and signal the end of the party.

A \$250 Security Deposit is required for all parties and will be credited back to your credit card within two weeks if all requirements have been met. In order to have the security deposit returned in full, the Party Host must:

- Adhere to the number of guests indicated on the Party Reservation
- Have all non-member guests leave at the allotted time of the Party
- Remove all decorations including tape and string
- Wipe down all tables and benches
- Sweep the floor and clean up any spilled beverages
- Dispose of all party litter properly with the trash bags carried out to the dumpster
- Return all furniture to its original position

Both the Party Fee and the Party Security Deposit are due 2 weeks prior to the reservation date.

### **Host Responsibilities:**

The host member is responsible for the conduct of his/her guests. All RVA Rules and Regulations apply. Party Guests must adhere to the RVA Parking Rules. Overflow street parking extending beyond the property should be limited to the right side of the street approaching the pool to allow adequate traffic flow and access for emergency vehicles as necessary. For overflow traffic please see the traffic flow map on the RVA website. Cars parked on the wrong side of the road may be towed by the police.

Rentals of any kind, such as Food Trucks, will need to be approved at the time of the reservation. Approval will be at the discretion of the Pool Manager.

Party cancellations must be done 72 hours in advance in order to receive a refund. This is due to Lifeguard Staffing requirements. In the event of Inclement Weather, a party may be cancelled or rescheduled with a 2 hour notice. Please email the RVA Administrator in this instance.



## TENNIS RULES AND REGULATIONS

Tennis Court Hours: 7:00 am to 10:30 pm

It is the intent of RVA to utilize the tennis courts for single or doubles tennis play, tennis instruction, basketball and social activities. The “honor system” is to be used for the regulation of play on the courts. The courts may be closed from time to time for special RVA sponsored events, required maintenance, and for tennis clinics or tournaments.

In order to provide a safe and orderly tennis environment, members and their invited guests or approved Child Care Providers must comply with the following list of rules while applying principles of common sense to address other unforeseen circumstances not specifically listed below. Close supervision, courteous and respectful behavior should govern all actions.

Play is available year round to members in good standing provided that the below listed rules are followed and a valid reservation exists:

### **The following is not permitted on the tennis courts:**

1. Climbing, hanging or swinging on nets, court fencing or doors
2. Bikes, scooters, rollerblades or other play items that may cause damage to the court surface
3. Shoes other than non-marking, flat soled athletic shoes
4. Glass containers, bottle caps, aluminum flip tops or food
5. Audible radios or televisions
6. Distracting behavior such as yelling or arguing
7. Non-playing unattended children
8. Unsportsmanlike conduct

### **Court Etiquette**

Tennis court use is only for racket sports, except for approved RVA sponsored events. In addition to courteous, respectful behavior toward others on the courts, players work to ensure that the courts remain safe and clean for everyone to enjoy. Players must close the door when entering and exiting the courts. No food or drinks other than water/sports drinks are allowed. Players must clean up the area of their trash and debris after finishing play. No pets are allowed inside the fenced area of the tennis courts.

### **Appropriate Attire**

Appropriate attire will be defined as athletic wear, including shirts, as well as shoes which are designed for tennis. Bare feet, sandals, flip flops and shoes that can mar the playing surface are not permitted.





## **Reservation Policy**

1. Reservations may be made year round by members in good standing.
2. Reservations must be made on the RVA website; a reservation is made for one hour for singles play and one and one half hours for doubles play.
3. Reservations may not be made on behalf of another member or by using other member's names.
4. Each membership (husband, wife, children) is permitted to reserve one court for one hour per day.
5. Doubles games may reserve one court for three hours provided two memberships are represented (it is not permissible for a husband and wife to reserve back to back one hour court time).
6. Invited guests are welcome to play when accompanied by the host member and only after registering and paying the guest fee. At least 50% of doubles players must be members.
7. A member may hold only one future reservation at a time. A future reservation may be made only on completion of play on a current reservation.

## **Guidelines for playing on a “walk-on” basis are as follows:**

1. Members and their invited guests are permitted to play tennis on a walk-on basis provided unreserved courts are available and at least 50% of the players are members. Guests must be properly registered and paid for as noted above.
2. Members playing on a “walk-on” basis must relinquish the court once any member holding reservations appears to claim the reserved court, provided that the member holding reservations is on time (the court is held for 10 minutes before forfeiture).
3. Members may play on a “walk on” basis as long as courts are available and as long as no one is waiting to play. In the event another party without reservations is waiting to play, the first party may play for one hour if singles play, or one and one-half hour for doubles play.
4. When entering the court on a “walk-on” basis, the member must sign in to claim the court for the hour and to let other parties know when the court will become available.

## **Children's Use**

1. Only one court at a time may be reserved by any one membership.
2. Children under age 12 must be accompanied and supervised by an approved Child Care Provider at all times while on the tennis court.



### **Clinics and Lessons**

Certain courts may be unavailable for reservation due to RVA sponsored clinics, lessons or special event. Such events will be scheduled to minimize disruption and will be designated on the website at least 48 hours prior to the event. Existing reservations will be taken into consideration.

Clinics and lessons are available for members only.

### **Teams and Leagues**

The organization, practice, scheduling or participation in leagues or teams including ALTA or USTA must be approved by the RVA Board of Directors and only if deemed in the best interest of the entire membership. Any ALTA or USTA teams must be comprised entirely of RVA members and use of courts for such activities will not take precedence over other scheduled reservations or RVA activities. Any ALTA or USTA play will be allowed only on weekdays before 6:00 pm.



## **SPORTS COURT USAGE**

Sports Court hours are 7:00am – 10:30pm

It is the intent of RVA to utilize the sport court for basketball, inflatable ball games, and social activities. The “honor system” is to be used for the regulation of play on the sport court. The court may be closed from time to time for special RVA sponsored events and required maintenance.

### **Rules**

In order to provide a safe and orderly environment, members and their invited guests or approved Child Care Providers must comply with the following list of rules while applying principles of common sense to address other unforeseen circumstances not specifically listed below. Close supervision, courteous and respectful behavior should govern all actions.

- Use of the court is on a first come first served basis – no reservations.
- For safety reasons, all persons using the court shall wear shoes.
- No food or liquids are to be brought on the court.
- Hanging from rims or nets is prohibited.
- Loud or obscene language is prohibited.
- When others are waiting:
  - Only half court basketball games are allowed.
  - Only one (1) game may be played for a maximum of thirty (30) minutes, after which the court must be relinquished.
  - Waiting players must remain outside the gate.
- Bicycles, scooters, in-line skates and skateboards of any style, are prohibited from being used on the court.
- Gum, tobacco, or use of alcohol is not allowed on court.
- Standing, hanging, or climbing on the fence or gate is not allowed.
